SCRIPT WE ARE THE GREATEST

(Suitable for a class)

(Vegetables enter stage and stand in their groups in a semi-circle, narrator/narrators stand to one side of the stage, the farmer is asleep on the other side of the stage.)

Narrator 1: One night as a farmer lay in bed, he heard the

clock strike midnight. Then he heard a chorus of

voices chanting.

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Farmer: Strange. A football match in the middle of the

night? Impossible.

Narrator 2: The farmer snuggled down to sleep again. But

there it was again.

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

SONG 1: WE ARE THE GREATEST

Narrator 3: The sound came from the garden right underneath

his window. He opened it, the moon was shining brightly, everything looked normal, then came a

voice from the lettuce patch.

Lettuce 1: Everyone knows that a lettuce is the greatest.

Lettuce 2: We can grow all the year round and a salad

wouldn't be a salad without lettuce.

Lettuce 3: We have very tender hearts and can be found in

green-grocer shops everywhere, for we are the

greatest.

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Tomato 1: That's what you think Mr. Lettuce, but you are

green and can be full of little creepy crawlies.

Tomato 2: Let me tell you that it's the tomato which gives the

salad colour and we are so juicy in the middle.

Tomato 3: We can be cut in pretty shapes and we taste so

good. We've got no competition, we are the greatest.

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Narrator 4: There were the tomatoes and lettuces pulling faces

at each other when the farmer heard yet another

vegetable having his say.

Onion 1: Now to make a real bit of flavour you need me.

(Other vegetables start to cry one by one as the onion speaks.)

Onion 2: An onion gives a salad a special touch and not only

salads, but stews and casseroles, pies and curries,

pizza and crisps.

(He stops to look around at everyone crying.)

Onion 3: O.K. so we make a few people cry. Nobody's perfect.

But we think we are definitely worth a few tears, for

we are the greatest ...

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Carrot 1: How about us then? We are such a bright and

beautiful colour and so sweet to taste.

Carrot 2: And don't forget we make a salad look so colourful

when we are grated up and sprinkled over.

Carrot 3: Besides, we help people to see in the dark.

Lettuce 1: Rubbish, that's an old wives' tale.

Carrot 3: Oh no it's not, we are full of healthy vitamins that the

body needs. That's why we are the greatest ...

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Narrator 5: After this he heard such a pushing and a groaning as

a great big potato pushed it's head above the

ground and said ...

Potato 1: Hello, Hello, What's going on here then?

Everyone knows that a salad would be nowhere

without a potato.

Potato 2: You can mash us, chip us, roast us, bake us in our

jackets, and of course there's all those crunchy crisps.

Potato 3: You ask the young ones which is the best part of the

salad, they'll shout for us for sure. Yes, we are the

greatest ...

Vegetables: We are the greatest, clap, clap,... clap,clap,clap.

(Twice)

Narrator 6: The farmer thought they must have finished now, but

no - there was another voice coming from the

greenhouse.

Cucumber 1: What about cucumbers then? We are so tall and

slender and so juicy in the middle.

Cucumber 2: We can have grooves cut down our sides, then when

we are sliced we look like pretty green stars all

round the edge of the dish.
